His visit formed part of efforts to meet the Executive Secretary, staff of the Secretariat and to receive updated briefings towards future plans and actions. The Executive secretary of APSTA, Dr. Cecile Oyono Thom together with staff of the secretariat, welcomed and received the Chairperson graciously. She was elated with the visit and very confident that, the meeting will push further, the necessary actions needed towards the executions of APSTA's mandate.

TfP Partners contribute to richer literature on contemporary peace **and security challenges and threats and proffer innovative approaches,** through the development and dissemination of key publications



For the first half of 2024, the TfP Partners produced key publications to enrich literature on thematic issues in peace and security, contribute to debates and knowledge gaps, and to provide new insights and recommendations to address the complex and evolving threats confronting the continent.

Through the Effectiveness of Peace Operations Network (EPON), two reports were published. The first one on Misinformation, Disinformation, Malinformation and Hate Speech (MDMH) and its impact on the Effectiveness of UN Peacekeeping Operations (UN PKOs) draws on four UN PKOs as case studies and further analyses two UN PKOs to provide and understand context-specific examples of the rising challenges that UN PKOs encounter on issues of MDMH. The four UN PKOs the study focuses on include the UN Organization Stabilization Mission in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (MONUSCO); the UN Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in the Central African Republic (MINUSCA); the UN Multidimensional Integrated Stabilization Mission in Mali (MINUSMA); and the UN Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS). The report identifies lessons and provides recommendations on how UN PKOs can broadly tackle MDMH and reinforce related efforts within these missions ...

The Executive secretary of APSTA, Dr. Cecile Oyono Thom together with staff of the secretariat, welcomed and received the Daillaire team. The meeting was held in the Situation Room (SR) of APSTA. In her welcome remarks, she was pleased with the visit and charged the team to explore strategic avenues for collaborations and partnerships. She said the timing was apt as we seek strategic ways to community engagement and Coorporate social responsibilities.

The meeting touched on various areas of partnerships through projects and creating lasting efforts to address issues of peace support operations through joint efforts from



international organizations and support mechanisms. Major General (Rtd). Ferdinand Safari, team lead for Daillaire Institute was pleased with the work of APSTA especially on leading the way on the African Continent in areas of IAPTC representations, training, institutional enhancement and capacity building alongside dialogue and research. He applauded the Secretariat for the many partnerships and joint initiatives in the past and hopes to explore future avenues for more collaborations.

The deputy Executive Secretary/Programmes Coordinator of APSTA, Mr. Christian C. M. Ichite, took the team through a comprehensive APSTA brief touching on programmes, projects, initiatives and future collaborations and highlighted the achievements and milestones of APSTA from 2020 to date. He also explained the scope of work, governance structure, team efforts and mandates towards PSO as a secretariat.


