APSTA Forum for Dialogue and Information Exchange May 30th 2024

Forum Brief

The African Peace Support Trainers Association (APSTA) held the maiden virtual Forum of Dialogue and Information Exchange, from 10h00 to 14h30 (CAT) on Thursday 30th May 2024. The virtual Forum, as platform for exchange, was birthed by recommendations from Member Institutions (MIs), as stop-gap mechanism, for MIs to engage on burning issues of concern to training and capacity building on the continent ad interim, prior to in-person meetings. The maiden Forum convoked over twenty (20) Directors of Training and Research, APSTA Focal Points from Member Institutions (MIs), as well as Prospective Training Institutions across Africa. The Executive Secretary of APSTA, Dr OYONO Nee THOM Cecile, in her welcome remarks, charged the distinguished representatives of MIs to deliberate objectively on all issues, as Heads of MIs eagerly await the outcome of the Forum.

The Director, IPSTC Nairobi Kenya, Brig Gen Joyce Sitienei, who graciously joined the Forum, emphasized the imperative for APSTA to play a more active role in agenda-setting on peace and security discourse at both continental and global discourse. She also stressed the need for the Association to play greater part in research on PSOs. The Chairperson and Director General of EMPABB, Mali, Col. Soulaymane SANGARE, represented by the Deputy Director, EMPABB, Col. Sidi Fofana urged representatives to engage issues constructively as well as underscore recommendations. He also declared open the Forum. The Forum ended on a very high note, as representatives of MIs and TCEs/TIs present, identified key issues and domains for urgent engagements and tasked APSTA Secretariat to take these up formally ...

South Sudanese police in Kapoeta trained on preventing crimes related to livestock

EASTERN EQUATORIA - Peace begins when there are limited crimes in every community.

In Kapoeta East county, crime investigators from the South Sudan National Police Services have been equipped with special skills to control and manage transhumance and livestockrelated crimes in the area.

Communities from Eastern Equatoria state living in border towns of Narus and Nadapal within Kapoeta county, and their immediate neighbours from Kenya, Uganda, and Ethiopia are pastoralists.

Cross-border livestock movements, which take place annually, have resulted in a disturbing spike in crimes such as cattle rustling and revenge killings. Often, such cases aren't fully investigated and perpetrators aren't held accountable.

To bridge this gap, the United Nations Police (UNPOL) officers serving with the UN Mission in South Sudan (UNMISS) held a two-day workshop to enhance capacities of local policing counterparts in helping reduce such crime ...

Protection of Civilians Week 2024 High-level Event «The Future of POC in UN Peacekeeping» (20 May 2024)



1. 2024 marks 25 years since the UN Security Council added the protection of civilians (POC) in armed conflict to its agenda. The decision was followed by the adoption of Resolution 1270 in 1999, authorizing the United Nations Mission in Sierra Leone (UNAMSIL) with the first explicit mandate to protect civilians from threats of physical violence. Since then, significant normative progress has been

made in terms of the development of the concept of POC in UN peacekeeping, with 16 peacekeeping missions mandated to protect civilians, five of which are currently active (MINUSCA, MONUSCO, UNIFIL, UNISFA and UNMISS).

- 2. UN peacekeeping, a global partnership involving peacekeepers from over 120 countries, has continually sought innovative approaches to address challenges. Initiatives like Action for Peacekeeping (A4P) and A4P+ set ambitious goals and priority areas for progress. The SecretaryGeneral's New Agenda for Peace, launched in July 2023, called for reflection on the limits and future of peacekeeping to enable more effective mission models in a changing geopolitical landscape. The Secretary-General also aims to convene the Summit of the Future in September 2024, providing an opportunity for cooperation to agree on the Pact of the Future, to address current and future challenges.
- 3. To advance the ongoing reflection on the future of protecting civilians in UN peacekeeping operations, the Department of Peace Operations (DPO) will collaborate with the McGill Centre for International Peace and Security Studies (CIPSS) and the Permanent Missions of Germany, the Republic of Indonesia and the Republic of Sierra Leone to the UN to host a side event during Protection of Civilians Week 2024 ...
