

AU - APSTA - UNOAU Roundtable Workshop on the Review of AU - ASF Training Policy and Training Standards held in Nairobi Kenya 12-14 Oct 2022

The AU in collaboration with APSTA and under the auspices of APSTA invited training experts as well as consultants to review the Policy and Standards, indicating areas of focus and key contextual changes over the last 16 years.

The ASF Training Policy and ASF Training Standards were developed in November 2006, on the basis of the Policy Framework for the Establishment of the ASF and Military Staff Committee (2003) and the ASF Doctrine (2006), to provide guidelines for the AU/RECs/RMs in the planning, coordination, conduct and control of training activities of the ASF. The policy and standards also indicated the levels of training for the ASF and designed a framework for coordination and harmonization of operations in the field. Since 2006, the Policy and Standards have been the basis for the preparation of ASF components for possible deployment into AU Peace Support Operations (PSOs).

The Roundtable convened a total of eleven (11) experts: four (4) from APSTA; four (4) from the AU Commission; one (1) from the UNOAU and two (2) independent experts - Mr Sivuyile BAM and Col (rtd) Festus ABOAGYE. In three (3) days, the experts interrogated the contents of the 2006 ASF Training Policy and ASF Training Standards, against the PSO Doctrine (2021) and the ASF Policy Framework. Areas of focus included the Training Architecture and Principles ...



The AU must not allow Tunisia's Saied to harm African unity



Tunisia's populist president is trying to divide us using a white supremacist conspiracy from Europe

On February 21, while addressing a National Security Council meeting in Tunis, Tunisia's President Kais Saied condemned irregular migration from sub-Saharan Africa and described it as a conspiracy to erase Tunisia's identity. "The undeclared goal of the successive waves of illegal immigration is to consider Tunisia a purely African country that has no affiliation to the Arab and Islamic nations," he said. "Hordes of illegal immigrants from sub-Saharan Africa are still arriving, with all the violence, crime and unacceptable practices that entails."

Two days later, as he called on Tunisia's interior minister to crack down on irregular migration, the 65-year-old leader denied accusations from human rights groups that his hateful comments were racist, and claimed those accusing him of racism "want division and discord and seek to damage our relations with our brothers". He, however, did not renounce his unsubstantiated claim that migrants from sub-Saharan Africa are arriving in Tunisia as part of a plot to alter its demographics. The estimated number of Black African migrants in Tunisia today, including those without proper documentation, is just 21,000. Given the country's 12 millionstrong population, they don't have anywhere near the numbers necessary to alter Tunisia's demographic composition ...

Terrorist « contagion » continues



The new AU Chairperson, President Azali Assoumani of Comoros, noted that although terrorism has been around for ages "since the Libyan crisis in 2011 it has really exploded, and particularly in Africa." As a result, thousands of foreign fighters and combatants flooded into the Sahel, which helped with importing terrorist groups onto the continent, along with "an uncontrollable circulation" of weapons". "In this way, progressively, terrorism took on greater and greater scope in Africa - from north to south. from east to west. And the terrorist contagion continues, broadening in almost all regions of Africa," he said, speaking through an interpreter. He vowed to "spare no effort" to ensure an AU flagship initiative to "silence the guns" by 2030, becomes a reality.

Different contexts, global threat

Like climate change, terrorism among the most serious threats to the international community, President Nyusi of Mozambique. delivering his first-ever remarks to the UN Security Council. "The expansion of terrorism is quite threatening, and it is driven by factors that vary from context to context. On one hand, radicalization based on identity variables fueled by intolerance and, on the other hand, the manipulation of socio-economic factors have accelerated recruitment to terrorist groups, particularly of the youth," he said, speaking through an interpreter. Citing the 2022 Global Terrorism Index, he reported that some 48 per cent of terrorism-related deaths occurred in Africa, while the Sahel is the "new epicentre" of terrorist attacks.





AU's silence the guns initiative under threat



The goal of silencing the guns in Africa this decade is being challenged by climate change, terrorism, coups and the continent's history. This is the message the head of the African Union initiative brought to the UN Security Council on Thursday. "The topic of this important debate is timely. It is coming at a moment when Africa is faced with multiple challenges that put at risk the attainment of the noble objectives of silencing the guns even by the new timeline of 2030. The causes of these challenges are historical, institutional, constitutional, economic, social and cultural. They relate also to the impact of climate change», said Mohamed Ibn Chambas, African Union High Representative for the Silencing the Guns Initiative.

On Tuesday, the president of Mozambique, Filipe Nyusi, who chaired the meeting, told Council members that the global terrorism threat remains critical. "We, the Africans, want peace on our Continent. We are aware that

to have a continent in peace, it is necessary that African leaders believe that a continent with silenced guns is possible. The leaders of our Nations have an added responsibility because they have the obligation to mobilize all sensitivities and secure the requisite means and resources at their disposal to fast track the silencing the guns once and for all», said Mozambican President, Filipe Jacinto Nyusi. In May 2013, African Union leaders adopted the «Silencing the Guns» initiative for an integrated, prosperous and peaceful Africa. In December 2020, the African Union extended the date to silence the guns in all Continent to 2030.
