# WORLD NEWS





The Southern Africa Development Community (SADC) on Monday approved the deployment of a regional force to the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) to help restore peace and security in the eastern part of that country. The decision was taken following the extraordinary summit of the Organ Troika of heads of state and government held in Windhoek.

The leaders approved a SADC common position to have a more coordinated approach, «given the multiple deployments under multilateral and bilateral arrangements in the eastern DRC.» Theyfurther urged the DRC government to put in place the necessary conditions and measures for effective coordination among sub-regional forces and bilateral partners operating in the country. In a communiqué, the leaders expressed concern over the deteriorating security situation prevailing in the eastern DRC and reiterated their strong condemnation of the upsurge of conflicts and activities of armed groups, including the resurgence of M23 rebels

The Chairperson of the African Union Commission (AUC), Moussa Faki Mahamat, will tomorrow, 2 May 2023, convene a follow-up meeting to the Peace and Security Council meeting of 16 April 2023 and of the Ministerial Special Session on Sudan held on 20 April 2023.

The meeting, which will take place at 2:00pmEAT,alignswiththeconclusions and spirit of the Ministerial meeting, which requested the Chairperson of the AU Commission to take appropriate measures to ensure full and efficient coordination of international efforts on the Sudan crisis.

Representatives of all participants at the ministerial meeting were invited to the meeting. The meeting, therefore, aims to identify priorities to be addressed, strengthen the unity and cohesion of the international community, consolidate ceasefire, alleviate the suffering of the Sudanese people, and lay the groundwork for the processes that will return Sudan to the path of transition to democratic, inclusive civilian rule ...

22<sup>nd</sup> ECCAS Summit : The United Nations Reiterates Its Support For Effective Regional Integration



The Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General for Central Africa and Head of the United Nations Regional Office for Central Africa (UNOCA), Mr. Abdou Abarry, participated in the 22<sup>nd</sup> ordinary session of the Conference of Heads of State and Government of the Economic Community of Central African States (ECCAS), held on 25 February in Kinshasa, the capital of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC).In his speech, Mr. Abarry underlined the immense potential of the sub-region in terms of natural and human resources, as well as the many challenges to peace and security that Central Africa continues to face despite progress achieved. In this context, he mentioned the commitment of the ECCAS Commission to cooperate with the United Nations.

"ECCAS, now in full swing, shows a strong determination to fully play its role as a pillar of the African Peace and Security Architecture in Central Africa. In this regard, I would like to welcome the process of linking the Multinational Force for Central Africa (FOMAC) to the new institutional framework of the Community," Mr. Abarry noted.

The Head of UNOCA also added that ECCAS, further supported to accomplish its mandate, could respond more effectively to issues related to political governance, youth engagement for peacebuilding, inter-community or crossborder violence, and the promotion and protection of human rights ...
