

APSTA and African Union Commission Host Validation Workshop for AU PSO Training Policy, 12 - 15 December 2023 in Nairobi Kenya

Experts from member institutions of the African Peace Support Trainers Association (APSTA) and African Union Commission validated the draft AU PSO Training Policy, 12 - 15 December 2023 in Nairobi Kenya. Recall that the validation is sequel to the Experts Roundtable on the document in October 2022 as well as several reviews conducted on the 2006 ASF Training Policy and 2006 ASF Training Standards, the result of which was a merger of both documents into the draft AU PSO Policy.

The Validation workshop convened a total of twenty-one (21) experts, from APSTA Member Institutions, RECs/RMs, AU Commission, UNOAU, independent experts and consultants including observers from UNITAR – courtesy of APSTA Secretariat.

In four (4) days, the experts validated the contents of the draft policy, against the PSO Doctrine (2021), the ASF Policy Framework and other related documents. Areas of focus included the Training Architecture and Principles of the Training Policy; Stages and Levels of Training Process; Training Responsibilities; Training Cycle; Funding, Cooperation and Coordination; as well as articulation of a Monitoring and Evaluation Framework for the Training Policy. This revised policy, after review and adoption by the Specialized Technical Committee on Defence, Safety and Security (STCDSS), will serve as new basis for the preparation of ASF/ PSO components for possible deployment into AU PSOs. Its noteworthy that the draft policy includes the imperative for the AU Commission to reinforce coordinating mechanisms like APSTA.

Data analysis on the impacts of illicit drugs in West Africa: The ECOWAS Commission officially launches the WENDU report (2020-2022)



In the context of addressing drugs and their consequences in West Africa, the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS), in collaboration with ENACT (Enhancing Africa's capacity to respond to transnational organised crime) project, has officially launched the West African Epidemiology Network on Drug Use (WENDU) Report 2020-2022, in Accra, Ghana on 27 November 2023.

This significant event brought together various participants including WENDU Focal Points, National Offices for combating drugs in ECOWAS Member States civil society organisations, and nearly seventy-five online participants including students, researchers, institutes, development partners, and other international organizations interested in drug-related data. The WENDU report offers valuable insights into the statistics and trends on illicit drug supply and use in the West African region.

During the opening ceremony, Dr. SINTIKI Tarfa UGBE, Director of Humanitarian and Social Affairs, on behalf of Prof. Fatou Sow SARR, Commissioner of Human Development and Social Affairs at the ECOWAS Commission, commended the implementers of the Enhancing Africa's Response to Transnational Organised Crime (ENACT) for their support for the WENDU Report. She stressed the importance of this report and the policy brief, which will greatly assist the ECOWAS Commission and its partners in identifying critical areas of drug prevention ...

Violence against women and girls remains one of the most prevalent and pervasive human rights violations in the world. Globally, an estimated 736 million women - almost one in three - have been subjected to physical and/or sexual intimate partner violence, non-partner sexual violence, or both, at least once in their life.

This scourge has intensified in different settings, including the workplace and online spaces, and has been exacerbated by post-pandemic effects, conflicts, and climate change.

The solution lies in robust responses, including

investment in prevention. However, alarmingly, data on how much nations are committing to counteract violence against women and girls remains glaringly sparse.

For instance, just 5% of government aid is focused on tackling violence against women and girls, and less than 0.2% is directed to its prevention.

We need more investment in women's organizations, better legislation, prosecution of perpetrators, more services for survivors, and training for law enforcement officials ...
